**The big event coming up in the next few weeks is the second Major of 2016, the US Open, at Oakmont Country Club, and I'm looking forward to it immensely.**

Last year I finished in a tie for second alongside Dustin Johnson and only one shot behind Jordan Spieth, and played the final 54 holes in 11 under par. So that first-round 77 probably cost me the Major, but this year gives me another chance.

The South Africans did well at Chambers Bay last year - Branden [Grace] finished on three under and Charl [Schwartzel] on two under, so all three of us were in the top seven. Here's hoping we can do something like that again - but go a little better this time.

It helps having those guys around on a week-to-week basis while on tour. Our schedules are pretty similar throughout the year so we do tend to stick together and fly the South African flag.

### CUT A DRIVE

This month you'll see I'm using an alignment stick, so with the cut I'll aim towards the left side of the fairway. I want to have my feet and everything else aimed that way. My club is going to release a little bit to the left, which creates the cutting action. The biggest thing here is to not drag the face of the club. If you do it will result in a block fade, which will leave you way out on the right. You still want to release the clubface, but you want to release it down the line to the left. So, by putting down the alignment stick, you definitely don't want to cut across it. But by letting it go down the left it will cut [to the right] just where you want it to be.
